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Tue. Sept 12 Arrive in Windhoek, capital of Namibia

Wed. Sept 13 Cosmic Origins – Today we will explore the cosmic origins

of the earth drawing upon Rudolf Steiner's indications in

Cosmic Memory and other lecture cycles.

Thurs. Sept 14 Ancient Cultures of Southern Africa – Today we will focus

on traditional and recent archaeological discoveries in southern Africa, illustrating that there were highly civilized communities that existed in this region over a 100,000

years ago.

Fri. Sept 15 The Golden Connection – Southern Africa has been known

in modern history as, literally, 'a gold mine', but the golden connection reaches back to Ancient India and before. In addition to the civilizations and trade surrounding gold, there are deeper spiritual significances as well as challenges with

the association of this precious metal.

Sat. Sept 16 Etheric Geography of Southern Africa – Today we will

focus on the unique etheric geography of the region and how it has shaped both the history and the people of southern Africa as well as the European explorers.

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Sun. Sept 17 Mark the Evangelist, The Lion and the Heart of the

World – Today the theme will be the ancient Christian connections in the continent through the Evangelist Mark. His symbol, as well as that of the Gospel is the Lion, which suggests why the African Continent is considered the

Heart of the World.

Mon. Sept 18 a.m. Drive into Windhoek – check in at Chameleon

Guesthouse – explore Windhoek – lunch and dinner on

your own.







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Tue. Sept 19

a.m. Safari orientation – depart for Safari and Etosha National Park.

p.m. Game drive visiting waterholes looking for predators as well as zebra, giraffe, elephant, rhino and many different species of antelope. Arrive and check in at **Halali Camp**. Dinner prepared by our guide over an open fire.

After dinner – A brief overview of the geography and geology of the region visited.

Wed. Sept 20

a.m. Sunrise game drive to catch predators while still active. After breakfast a second game drive to Etosha Pan, a 4500 sq km 'saline desert'.

p.m. Final game drive across the park. Check in at **Etosha Village Lodge**. Dinner prepared by our guide and an early night is recommended.

After dinner – A brief overview of the ecology of the region.

Thu. Sept 21

a.m. Early morning departure to visit the communal lands of Damaraland and the farmers in this arid region. Stop at the Ugab River bridge to visit beautiful Herero ladies who sell their small art and craft items to support their families.

p.m. Drive through the Namib Desert to the last shipwreck on the Skeleton Coast before arriving in Swakopmund. Check in at **Hotel a la Mer**.

Free time to explore this seaside town. Dinner at local restaurant (own expense).

After dinner – A brief overview of the flora and fauna of the region, their gestures and symbolism and how they interact with both humans and animals.

Fri. Sept 22

a.m. Free time for further exploration – recommendation: Museum or Aquarium or a two–hour sand boarding experience in the dunes. Departure from Swakopmund at 12:00 noon.

p.m. Drive through Namib Desert via the Kuiseb Pass and Solitaire, check in at **Desert Camp**.

Free time to relax before taking a short walk to see the sunset over the Naukluft mountain range. Pool and bar available while dinner is prepared by our guide.

After dinner – A brief overview of the animals of the region, their gestures, spiritual significance and symbolism.









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Sat. Sept 23

a.m. Early departure to drive down ancient riverbed surrounded by towering dunes (around 55kms) and take a 4×4 shuttle into the Sossusvlei area to appreciate the beauty, peace and tranquility of this place. Further exploration in Dead Vlei with bleached cracked clay and skeletal camel thorn trees, with a backdrop of huge dunes with their ever—changing colours. Walk or take the 4×4 shuttle back to our vehicle.

p.m. Stop at the famous Dune 45 to climb or wander around the base. Visit the nearby Sesriem Canyon, before returning to **Desert Camp**.

After dinner – Personal reflections on the experience from each participant.

Sun. Sept 24

a.m. Early departure to Solitaire Cheetah Sanctuary to see cheetahs held with the hope of re–introducing them into a large reserve.

p.m. Return to Windhoek and check in at **Chameleon Guesthouse** for one more night. Group farewell dinner at local restaurant (own expense).

Mon. Sept 25

Check out and flights home.
